MEASUREMENTS

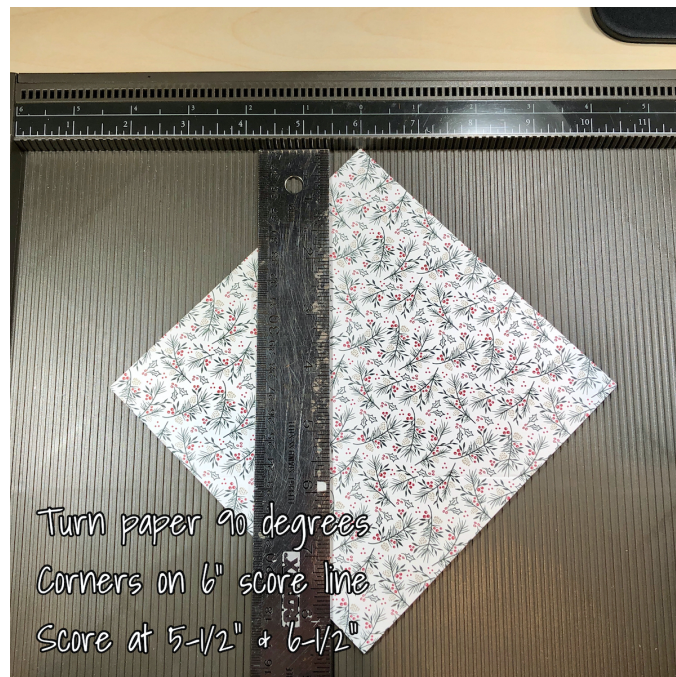
- Designer Series Paper - pattern of your choice - full 6"x6" sheet
- Basic White: scrap for sentiment
- Cherry Cobbler: scrap for sentiment and berries
- Mint Macaron & Evening Evergreen: scraps for holly leaves

INSTRUCTIONS

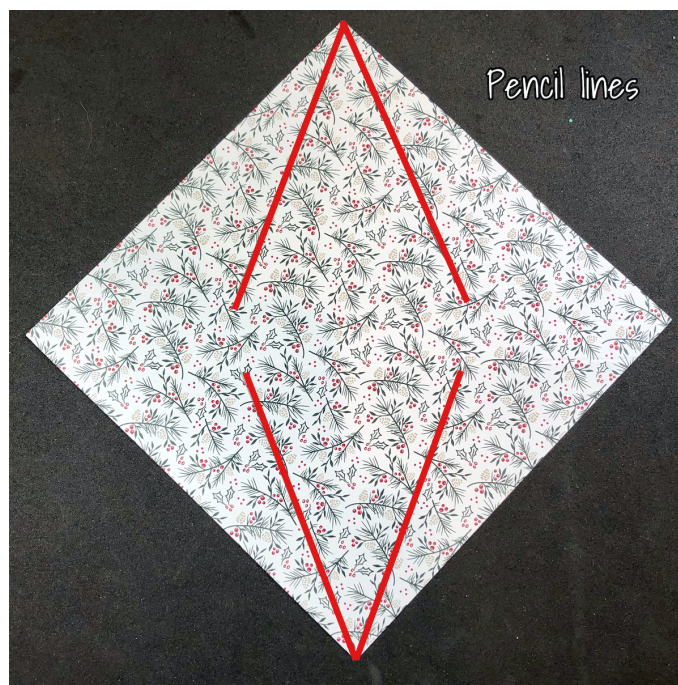
1. Place your DSP on your scoring board in a diamond shape, so that the corners are on the 6" line. Score paper at the 4-1/2" and 7-1/2" marks.



2. Turn your DSP 90 degrees so that the opposite corners are now at the 6" mark on your scoring board. Score paper at the 5-1/2" & 6-1/2" marks.



3. Before taking the paper off of the board, score approximately 1-3/4" along the 6" line, at both the top and bottom of the paper. This will create the fold lines for the inside of the tree



4. Use a pencil and ruler to mark the diagonal lines for the trees on both the top and bottom of the paper. The lines will run from the corner, down to the corner where the scores lines meet.



5. Cut along the drawn lines.

6. Cut off the excess paper between the cut lines and the score line. It's a thin triangle of paper.



7. Turn the paper so that the triangle with the two score lines that are an inch apart is facing you. Cut the paper, 1/2" away from the right score line. This will be the tab that attaches to the large triangles for the tree. Repeat with the other three sides.



8. Cut a notch into the tab, close to where the score lines meet.



9. Add adhesive to all four tabs. You can use Stampin' Seal+ or Tear and Tape as it needs to be strong enough to hold the tree box closed when it has something inside of it.



10. Attach the first tab to the side of the triangle, and then repeat with the other three tabs.



11. Gently squeeze the sides together, along the short score lines on the paper.



12. Die cut a stitched star from the gold metallic paper. Attach to the front of the tree with a glue dot.

13. Using Versamark ink, stamp the 'for you' onto a piece of scrap Basic White cardstock. Sprinkle gold embossing powder, shake off the excess, and emboss with the Heat Tool.

14. Die cut the phrase with the scallop oval opening on the Messages Die.

15. Die cut the holly leaves from Soft Succulent and Evening Evergreen cardstock. There are three sets of each leaves on the die, so you only need to cut each colour once for each tree.

16. Die cut the berries from Cherry Cobbler cardstock.

17. Attach the leaves and berries to the back of the scalloped oval. Adhere to the tree with Stampin' Dimensionals.
